Leviticus 19:9 "When you will reap the harvest of your land, you shall not completely reap a corner of your field, and the gleanings of your harvest you shall not gather."

Remember the "nothing left on your plate" rule from childhood? If we equate our plates with our lands (or better, our portions with our harvest), then this verse would seem to suggest something otherwise. We are compelled to think about our actual needs and the needs of those around us. When we do not have the appetite to finish a meal, instead of forcing ourselves to eat it, or discarding it in a disgusting manner, we should leave the half hot dog, or remaining slice of pizza near the garbage can (still not littering). We should bring our "gleanings" and our "corners" to where the homeless and hungry are. Just as Seven Stars Coffee House does with our Knead-a-Hand program, we should encourage local shops to donate their "end of the day" foodstuffs to those in need. We do not need a field in order continue to observe the above *mitzvah* today. All we need is the motivation. -AO

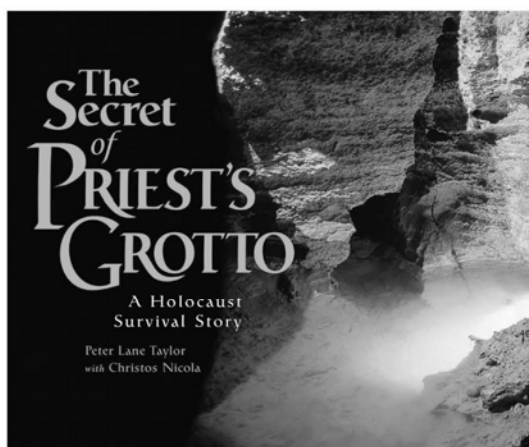
