We often joke about events and programs running on "Jewish time." Believe it or not, punctuality has always been a challenge for the Jewish people. We have not always had a newspaper or *luah* to check candle-lighting times or *parashiyot*. Sforno understands that this verse (specifically, the words "all your dwelling places") suggests that the start and end of Shabbat is different for every place in the world, and depends on the times of that location (day/night). For us, today, that may be a given. But the new moon (*Rosh Hodesh*) depended on the witnessing by a central location—and therefore this is quite a different standard. We can learn from this that Shabbat is always here, everywhere, on the seventh day—whether we like it or not. And since it is bound to arrive – and pass – the Torah teaches us to bring Shabbat into our homes, and accept it. An official day off—no matter where you are. But if you're not paying attention and the days of your week blend one right into the next, you will surely miss it. What better an opportunity to pay close attention to the setting sun and the stars in the sky than the festival of Sukkot! -AO

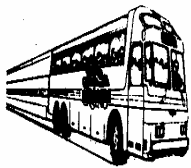
